1 Angel Garden | \$3,000,000

Approaching the shelter is a beautiful natural setting with wildflowers to attract butterflies along with a sculpture of an angel. This space offers a welcoming and calm environment, enhanced by the curved stone wall in close proximity. All those who enter know they are protected by the angels within.

2 Welcoming Lobby

The Welcoming Lobby provides a warm and a positive first impression to all who arrive at Children's Inn. People entering will be greeted by caring, friendly staff who will offer assistance to meet their needs.

4 Great Conference Room

As a community partner, Children's Inn will host many meetings, trainings, gatherings and celebrations in this spacious room.

3 Outdoor Courtyard

Outside the shelter in the back yard will be a large, secure courtyard with green space and gardens for clients to relax in a natural setting. It also includes significant space for children, including a playground, sandbox, basketball court and room to ride bikes.

5 Children's Playground

Within the outdoor courtyard is a large, secure playground for children which includes a swing set, playset, sandbox, basketball court and room to ride bikes.

7 Client Village #1

A place to call home, the 10 bedrooms with 27 beds, along with laundry, a lounge area, and bathrooms, provide victims of abuse and their children a sense of peace and hope they once believed didn't exist before coming to Children's Inn.

9 Client Village #3

Victims of abuse deserve a place of dignity and healing. With 12 bedrooms and 31 beds, a lounge area, bathrooms, and laundry, this village will help those staying at Children's Inn regain a sense of peace.

6 Children's Village

When their own homes are no longer safe, children will find comfort and security in one of the 10 beds in this wing. Six bedrooms, gathering space, reading areas, bathrooms, and laundry make this wing a safe haven for children who are placed in our care.

8 Client Village #2

No one grows up dreaming of living in a domestic violence shelter, but this welcoming village of 10 bedrooms, 28 beds, bathrooms, laundry, and a lounge area gives individuals everything they need to feel safe and begin a life free from violence.

10 Crisis Support Center

16 Play Room

Children express themselves through play, which can be even more therapeutic for children who have experienced trauma. This play room provides play items, gross motor equipment, and a safe space for children to do their job — play.

17 Teen Room

Being a teen staying in a shelter isn't easy, so they deserve their own space. This room will have this quiet, comfortable space for teens to play games.

18 Support Group Room

As a dedicated room for support groups, this space provides a safe, calming and therapeutic setting for participants to process their trauma and begin the journey of healing.

19 Outreach Wing

A lot of important work is done outside of the shelter. Our outreach staff includes therapists, our parenting coordinator and our outreach advocate. Their offices, where they meet with individuals to provide education, advocacy and therapy, can be found in this wing.

20 Client Clothing Store

Clients often come into shelter with nothing but the clothes on their backs. The client clothing "store" provides everything from pajamas to coats and shoes, ensuring clients have comfort and dignity.

Food has a lot of meaning in our own home, our cooks prepare a meal that is prepared. Home-cooked meals are prepared and served without interruption.

23 Client Meeting Rooms (x6)

When an individual in crisis needs the support of an advocate to fill out a protection order, discuss a safety plan, coordinate with community resources, or just have a shoulder to cry on, these safe, confidential meeting rooms provide the space to accommodate this.

24 Conference Observation Room

Although their own homes may not have been safe, children who have been removed from their homes and placed at Children’s Inn still want and deserve to have relationships with their families. In our conference observation room, families have the chance to visit, while staff can supervise and ensure safety of the child.

25 Client Hub Resource Center

The client hub resource center is the heart of the shelter. It’s where individuals can find a staff person to assist with any need, no matter the time of day or night. Knowing someone is always here to help provides clients with a sense of security during a time of uncertainty.

26 Therapy Client Waiting Area

Clients can gather their thoughts while waiting to meet with their therapists in this quiet, confidential space.

27 Play Therapy Room

For children who have experienced trauma, therapy through play is a healing way to relieve stress and manage emotions in a safe space. This room will have all the tools our therapists need to help children on their journey.

30 Bedrooms (x38)

The bedrooms at Children’s Inn will provide those staying with us a safe, comfortable haven where they can finally get a peaceful night’s rest—which may have often been impossible in a home where abuse was present.

31 Laundry Room

With the potential of 96 guests staying with us, the need to launder bedding and towels will be ongoing. Commercial style laundry machines give us the ability to provide guests with clean, fresh linens.

32 File/Mail Room

Confidential documents, such as protection orders, housing applications, and other important papers will be easily accessed by staff in this filing room.

33 Shelter Intake Room

After clients are welcomed at Children’s Inn, their belongings are processed and sorted to determine what they need to keep with them in shelter and what can be safely stored.

34 Family Lounge (x6)

Connecting with others who may be experiencing something similar to their own circumstances can provide clients with a sense of belonging. Each village has two lounge areas that will allow families to gather and visit with others staying in that village.

35 Shelter Staff Offices (x12)

It takes a village to do this work. The offices throughout the shelter side of the building will house our case managers, crisis advocates, child care providers and supervisors.

36 Outreach Advocate

Victims of abuse in our community who are not in need of our shelter or have left shelter but have continued advocacy and case management needs, are supported by our outreach advocate. This office will be a safe place to find ongoing support from Children’s Inn.

37 Parenting Office

Parenting is the toughest job you’ll ever have. The parenting coordinator provides individual parenting classes for those in need of support and education as they work to be the best parents they can be.

38 Therapy Offices (x4)

Healing from trauma and abuse takes time and support. Our therapists offer guidance and compassion through individual, family and child therapy.

39 Workroom

Essential to the operations of a 24/7 facility, the workroom houses a printer, copier, fax machine, staff mailboxes and office supplies.
